Quick Recap of Where we Are



2025 Oregon Legislature's Pro-Nuclear Bills

- SB 215: Repeals Oregon's 1980 Ballot Measure Law and refers it to a vote of the people, for approval or rejection, in the next regular general election taking place on November 3, 2026.
- SB 216: Repeals Oregon's 1980 Ballot Measure Law without voter referral.
- SB 635: Directs Oregon State University (OSU) to conduct a feasibility study on nuclear energy generation in Oregon. The bill does not identify who actually pays for this study and requires OSU to submit its report to the Legislature

2025 Oregon Legislature's Pro-Nuclear Bills

- HB 2038: Directs the Oregon Department of Energy (ODOE) to study the “advantages” of nuclear energy, but not its disadvantages! ODOE is to submit its findings to the Legislature.
- HB 2410: Provides a clever exemption to Oregon’s 1980 Ballot Measure Law, with no statewide vote of the people. Only citizens of Umatilla County get to vote on whether to implement this Act. It allows Oregon’s Energy Facility Siting Council to issue a site certificate for a Small Modular Nuclear Reactor (SMNR) demonstration project, with an unknown number of SMNRs, to be sited in Umatilla County.
- HB 2426: Is the same as SB 215.

1. Sign up for notifications

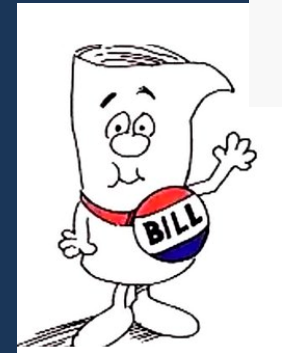
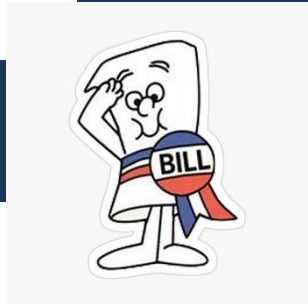
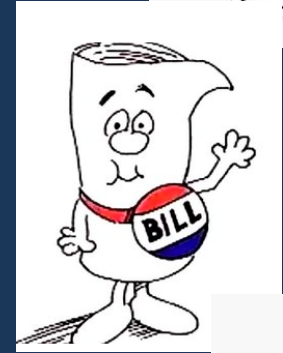
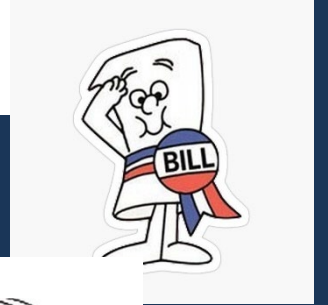
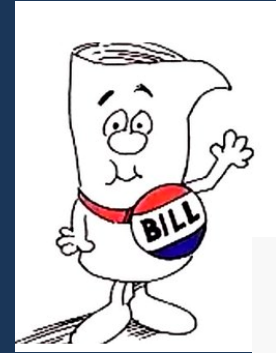

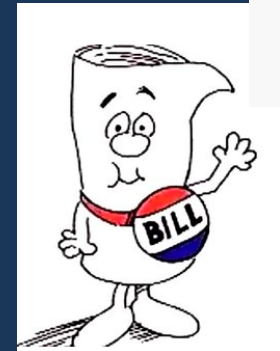
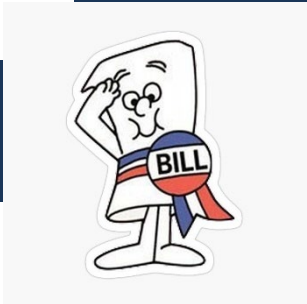
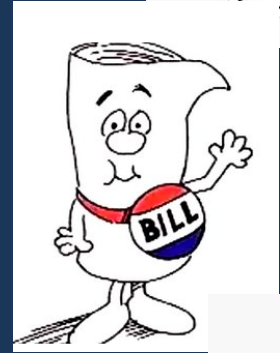
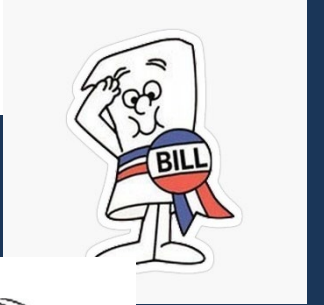
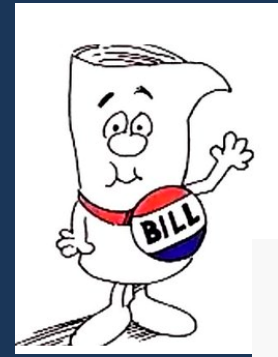
2. Contact your Rep. AND your Senator.

Ask them to vote against any bill that compromises our 1980 ballot measure's provisions. Include bill numbers.



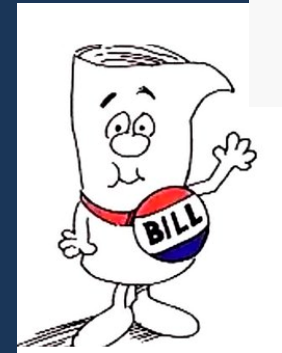
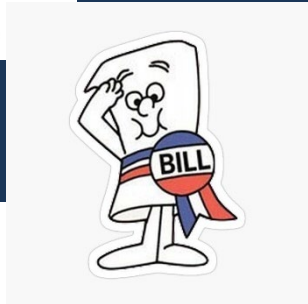
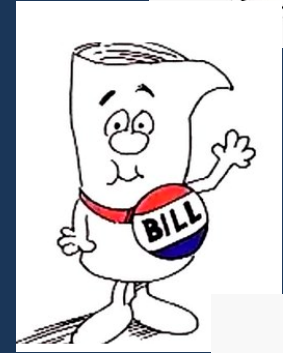
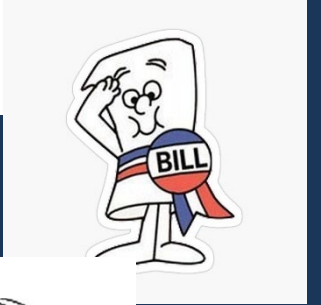
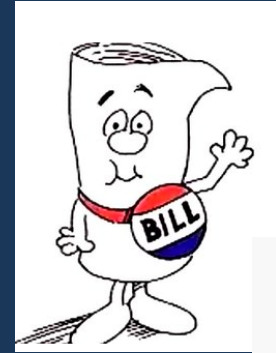

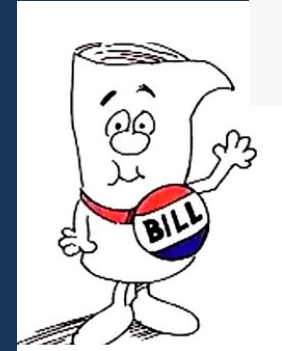
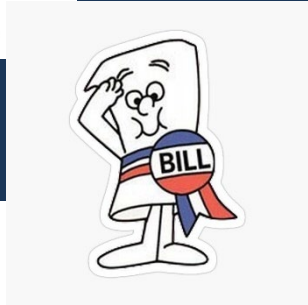
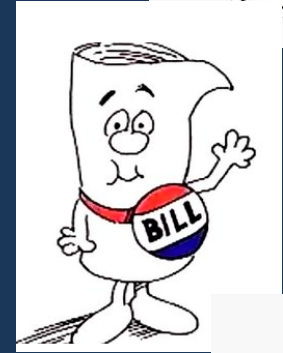
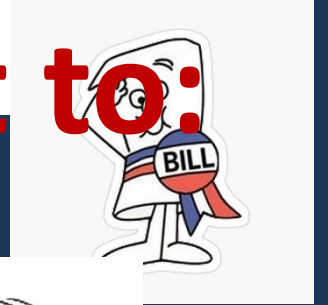
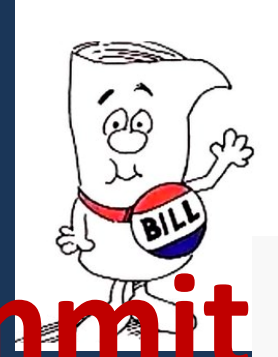
1. Not to give any of the pro-nuclear bills a work session and
